

The Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme, 2014-15

Background

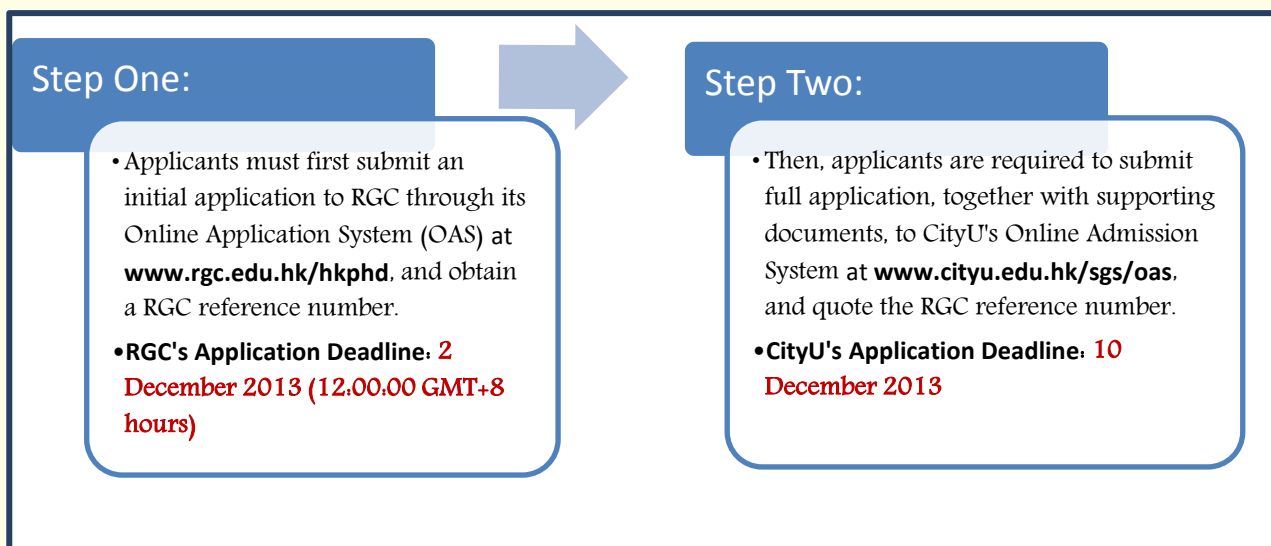
1. Established in 2009 by the Hong Kong Research Grants Council (RGC), the Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme aims at attracting the best and brightest students in the world to pursue their PhD programmes in Hong Kong's institutions.

Eligibility

2. Applicants who are seeking admission as new full time PhD students in UGC-funded institutions of Hong Kong, irrespective of their country of origin and ethnic background, should be eligible to apply. Applicants should demonstrate outstanding qualities of academic performance, research ability / potential, communication and interpersonal skills, and leadership abilities.

Application Procedure and Deadlines

3. Applications to the Fellowship Scheme will be invited from 2 September 2013 - 2 December 2013 (by noon). Applicants are required to submit online applications both to the RGC and CityU.



4. Late applications will not be processed. The application procedures and timeline for processing applications for the Hong Kong PhD Fellowship Scheme is given in Annex 1.
5. Each applicant may choose up to two programmes in one institution or two programmes in two different institutions for PhD study when applying for the Hong Kong PhD Fellowship at the RGC. This year, RGC allows applicants to make changes to their programme choices on RGC's Initial Application Form by the close of RGC's application deadline.

Fellowship and Award

6. The Fellowship awarded by the RGC provides a monthly stipend of HK\$20,000 (approximately US\$2,600) and a conference and research-related travel allowance of HK\$10,000 (approximately US\$1,300) per year for the awardees for a maximum period of three years.

7. For Fellowship awardees who are admitted to a 4-year PhD programme in 2014-15, CityU will provide a monthly studentship at the same level as the Fellowship awarded by the RGC for their fourth year of study.
8. In addition, CityU offers **Chow Yei Ching School of Graduate Studies Entrance Scholarships**. Fellowship recipients at CityU will be awarded *the Chow Yei Ching School of Graduate Studies Entrance Scholarship*. The Scholarship, at the value of HK\$66,000 (approximately US\$8,470), covers students' tuition and on-campus hostel accommodation fees in their first year of research studies.

Selection Criteria

9. While the academic excellence is of prime consideration, the Selection Panels will take into account, but is not limited to, the following criteria (with weighting) for the selection of candidates as follows:

Research Ability and Potential (Weighting = 20%)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Publication(s) (if available) • Recommendation from nominating/affiliated institutions/ and referees. • Interview assessment by nominating institution(s) (via telephone, face-to-face, or other communication means as decided by individual institutions)

Leadership Ability and Societal Responsibility (Weighting = 10%) Communication and Interpersonal Skills (Weighting = 10%)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Involvement in academic/extra curriculum activities and volunteer work • Working experience • Vision Statement • The ability to communicate clearly and logically in written and oral formats (by interview)
Institutional Support (Weighting = 5%)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Convincing and strong justifications given by the institution that meet the objectives of the Scheme backed by solid data

10. Shortlisted candidates will be invited by the applying institutions to admission interview (either face-to-face or via telephone). Nominees' performance during the interview would be one of the important parameters in assessing the applicant's research potentials.

Selection and Nomination by Institutions

11. When making nominations, institutions are required to classify the candidates into two categories – “Sciences, Medicine, Engineering & Technology” and “Humanities, Social Sciences and Business Studies”, and to rank (a general ranking of top 5%, top 10%, top 20%, etc.) the nominees among the candidates of the relevant category.
12. Each institution will conduct a *plagiarism checking* on the “Research Plan” and “Vision Statement” submitted by Fellowship applicants. In the event that an applicant has submitted false information or committed plagiarism with suspicious contents, both applications for the Fellowship Scheme and admission application at CityU may be disqualified.
13. As stipulated by the RGC, for applicants from non-English speaking universities, unless they provide proof that English is the language of instruction for all courses for the entrance qualifications of their proposed PhD programmes, they are required to attach score results of Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IETLS) in their PhD applications. College English Test (CET) Band 6 is not accepted as equivalent test.
14. Firm admission offer using regular UGC-funded RPg quota will be given to selected CityU’s nominees, even if they failed to obtain the Fellowship. The admission offer will be confirmed by the University in January 2014.

RGC’s Selection Panels

15. Shortlisted applications, subject to their areas of studies, will be reviewed by one of the two HKPF Selection Panels with experts in the relevant broad areas -- one for “Sciences, Medicine, and Engineering & Technology” and another one for “Humanities, Social Sciences and Business Studies”.

Notification of Results

16. The RGC will notify the successful applicants of the results in March 2014.

Timeline/Deadline	Application and Selection Procedures
2 December 2013 (12:00:00 GMT +8 hours)	Applicants submit initial application to RGC's Online Application System (OAS) at www.rgc.edu.hk/hkphd to obtain a reference number
10 December 2013	Applicants submit full application to CityU's Online Admission System at http://www.cityu.edu.hk/sgs/oas .
From September – 20 December 2013	Each School/Department forms an selection panel to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• consider applications and conduct admission interviews• perform plagiarism checking on the “research proposal” and “vision statement” of the recommended applications• complete online Application Evaluation Form and forward recommendations, via School Deans/HoDs to the respective C/SGSCs.
by 3 January 2014 latest	C/SGSCs consider and send their recommendations to CRDC.
13 January 2014	CRDC consider C/SGSCs' recommendations and finalize CityU's nominations.
by noon, 16 January 2014	SGS submit CityU's nominations and the application data to RGC.
February 2014	The Review Panels nominated by the RGC will review nominations submitted by all HK institutions.
March 2014	The RGC Secretariat will notify successful candidates about the Fellowship Scheme results via email and publicize the list of awardees on the RGC website.
